This money will be used to fund the Fred Sullivan Bursary to help one or more deserving students per year at the college.

Fred Sullivan grew up on the family farm that was located where the City View United Church is today.

In 1939, Fred enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force and served overseas during World War II.

During his time in the service, Fred was awarded with the Mention in Despatches Award in 1944 and the British Empire Medal in 1946.

Fred Sullivan joined the Kiwanis Club

of Nepean in 1973 and was a very active member who served our community well for many years.

Fred passed away in Ottawa on December 17, 1996. Since his death, in his honour, the Kiwanis Club of Nepean established the Fred Sullivan Bursary at Algonquin College in 1997.

This year an endowed gift of \$5000 was given and matched by the Provincial Government to ensure Fred Sullivan's legacy will continue in the future.

Fred always praised people for the work they did and if you listen carefully, I am sure we can all hear Fred say, "You did a good job".
