## Environmental Technician: Equipment List

### Basic Gear List:

- Backpack (day) > \$35
- Calculator (Scientific) > \$30 - \$50
- Clipboard/Notebook > \$17 - \$40
- CSA approved boots (work or hiking variety) > \$100 - \$150
- FOX40 whistle > \$7 - \$9
- Hard Hat > \$50
- Heavy duty winter clothing > \$ varies
- Lab Notebook (some available in campus bookstore)
- Life Jacket (PFD) > \$50 - 75
- Lunchbag > \$10
- Pencils/Pens/Sharpies
- Personal first aid kit – band aids, swabs, polysporin, etc. > \$45
- Rain gear – hooded jacket and pants, rain gear is essential > \$45 - \$95
- Reflective Vest - \$10 - \$20 (some available in campus bookstore)
- Sunscreen and bug repellent > \$7 - \$70
- Chest Waders - chest > \$75 - \$500 \*\*Details will be provided
- Warm layers: snow pants, fleece pants, sweater, hats, mitts, etc - \$60 - \$90
- Water Bottle > \$20
- Rite in the Rain Notebook > \$25 (some available in campus bookstore, level 2 and 3)
- Compass (360°) with adjustable declination setting > \$60 - \$90 (optional certs only)

### Optional:

- Waterproof Backpack > \$40
- Binoculars – lightweight > \$40 - \$200
- Variety of Field Guides (some will be mandatory)
- GPS > \$100 - \$300
- Waterproof Gloves (winter)
- Multitool – Swiss or Leatherman > \$30 - \$100
