# Key Performance Indicators (KPI)

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## ***Data Collection Process***

The Key Performance Indicators Initiative is all about...Accountability and Excellence. The Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities, and Ontario's 24 community colleges have joined forces to implement this confidential standardized survey process. The survey allows each college to obtain valuable client feedback in areas such as: graduate employment, graduate satisfaction and employer satisfaction.

The results of two survey cycles are delivered in this report for your convenience. The information illustrates the employment status of college graduates from post-secondary and adult training programs in the following periods:

May 1, 2001 to April 30, 2002  
May 1, 2000 to April 30, 2001

## ***How is the Data Gathered?***

Six months after graduation the graduates are contacted by an independent consulting firm (hired by the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities) regarding their employment status and their satisfaction with their college experience. Contact is made with the graduate by telephone for a specific reference week, i.e. 1st week of March for August graduates; 1st week of July for December graduates; 1st week of November for April graduates.

At the time of contact, if the graduate is employed, he/she will be asked for permission to survey his/her employer. Employers are surveyed by telephone by the same consulting firm, who contacted the graduates, within a month of the graduate granting permission. Employers are asked to comment on the graduate's workplace abilities based on knowledge and skills acquired from their college program.

Following the guidelines of the Freedom of Information Act, information used in this report is obtained by telephone directly from each graduate and employer.

To maintain adequate confidentiality in light of the Freedom of Information Act, salary information may reflect provincial averages or may be blank (if provincial average salaries are not available) for programs in which fewer than five Algonquin College graduates reported salaries.

Graduate and employer satisfaction survey information are also included in this report in chart format.

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## **TOTAL GRADUATES - 3 865**

Total number of graduates from full-time certificate, diploma and post-diploma programs between May 1, 2001 and April 30, 2002.

## **RESPONDED TO SURVEY - 2 830**

Total number of graduates who responded to the questionnaire by telephone. All survey results are based on this number.

## **AVAILABLE FOR EMPLOYMENT - 2 315**

Total number of graduates who were employed or actively seeking employment.

## **TOTAL EMPLOYED - 2 060**

Total number of graduates (of those available for employment) employed in related or unrelated, full-time or part-time positions, six months after graduation.

## **TOTAL EMPLOYED RELATED - 1 482**

Total number of graduates (of those available for employment) who were employed full-time (more than 30 hours per week) or part-time (less than 30 hours per week) in a position related or partially related to their field of study.

## **TOTAL EMPLOYED WITH MORE THAN 1 JOB - 365**

Total number of graduates (of those available for employment) who were employed with more than 1 job during the reference week.

## **LOW - HIGH ANNUAL SALARY RANGE**

The lowest and highest annual salaries reported from graduates employed in their field of study.

## **AVERAGE SALARY**

Average salaries are calculated by using the salary information reported by graduates employed full-time in their field of study. All salaries are calculated based on a 40-hour work week.

## **NUMBER OF SALARIES REPORTED - 927**

Total number of salaries reported by graduates employed full-time in their field of study.

## **TOTAL EMPLOYED UNRELATED - 553**

Total number of graduates (of those available for employment) who were employed full-time (more than 30 hours per week) or part-time (less than 30 hours per week) in a position unrelated to their field of study.

## **EMPLOYED BUT STILL LOOKING FOR ANOTHER JOB**

Total number of graduates (of those available for employment) employed in related or unrelated, full-time or part-time positions, six months after graduation, who are looking for another job.

## **ACCEPTED A JOB AT A LATER DATE - 24**

Total number of graduates who had accepted a job to begin after the reference week.

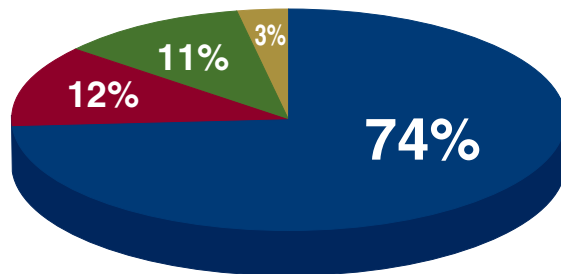

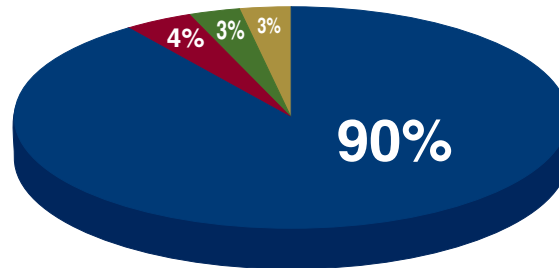
### Graduate Satisfaction

Satisfaction with usefulness of your college education in achieving your goals after graduation.



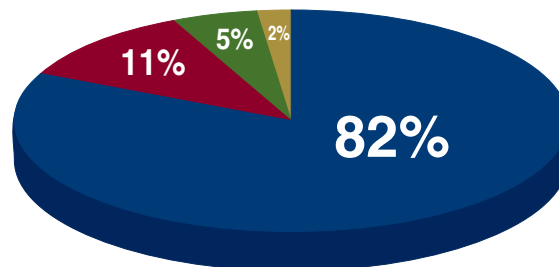
### Employer Satisfaction

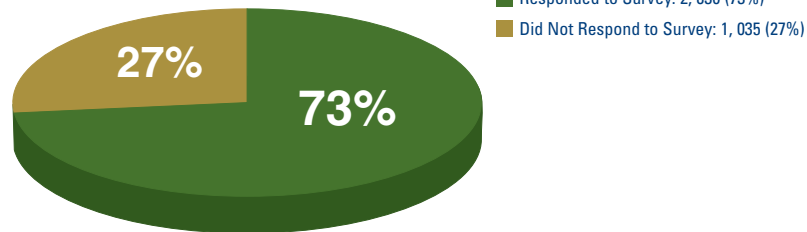

### Algonquin Graduates Response to Survey

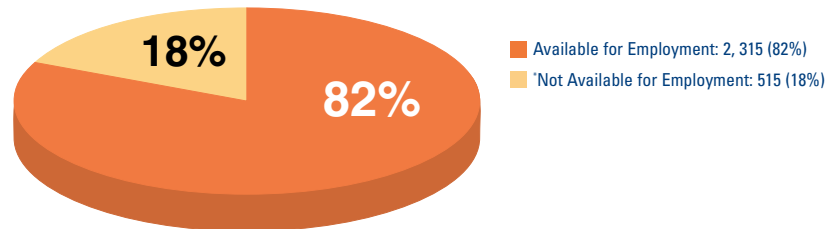

### Availability of Algonquin Graduates for Employment

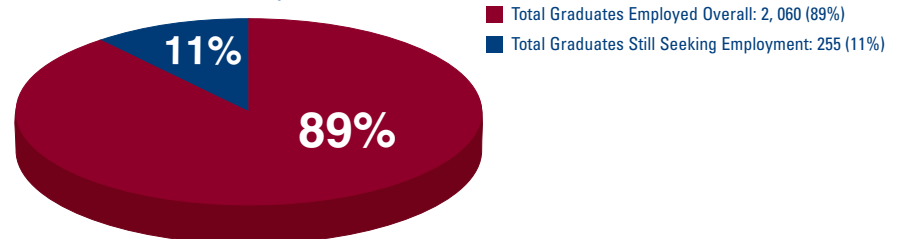

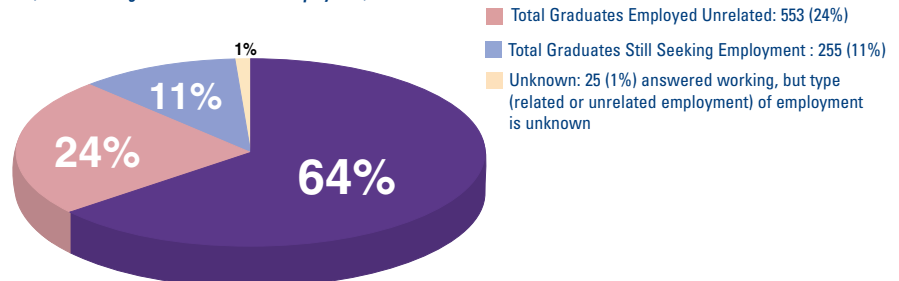
### Employment Status

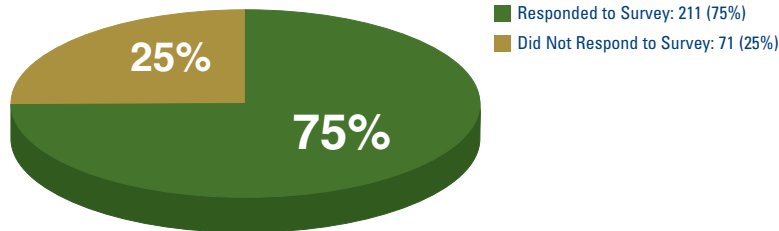

### Algonquin Pembroke Campus Graduates Response to Survey

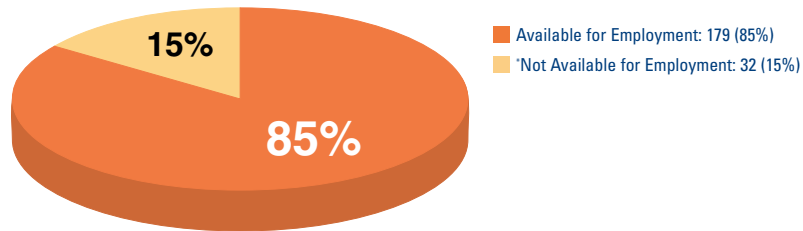

### Availability of Algonquin Pembroke Campus Graduates for Employment

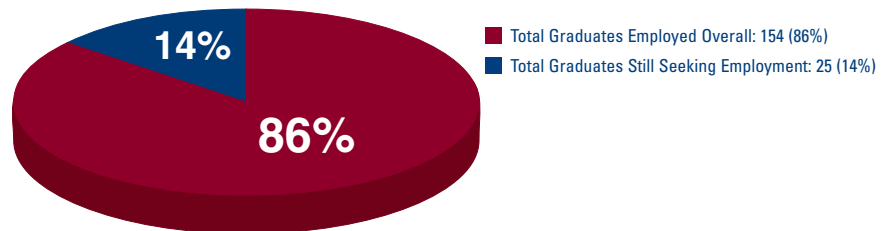

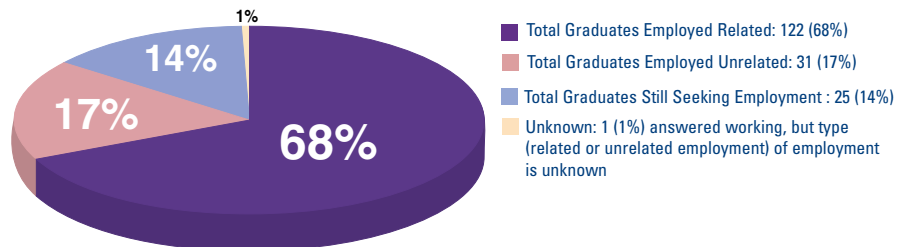
### Employment Status

(of the 179 Pembroke Campus graduates available for employment)



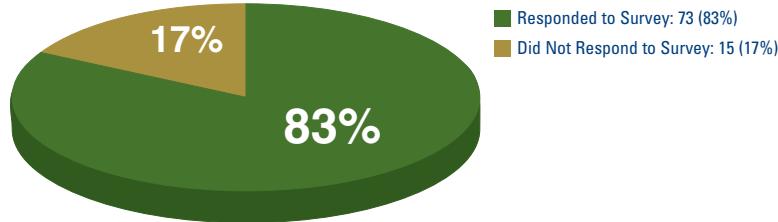

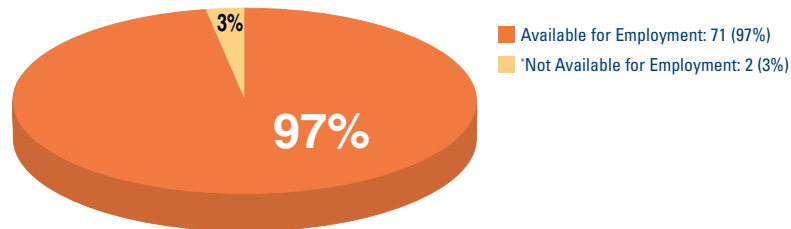
## Perth Campus

### Algonquin Perth Campus Graduates Response to Survey (of the total of 88 graduates for 2001 - 2002)



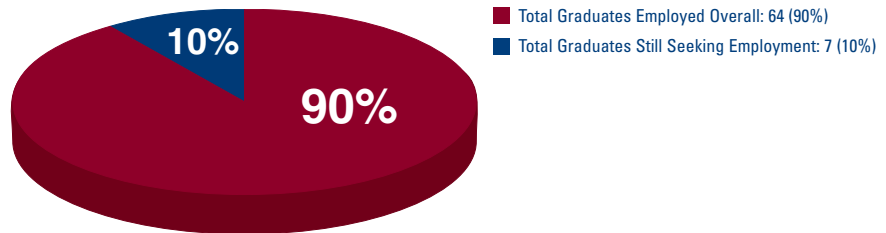
### Availability of Algonquin Perth Campus Graduates for Employment (of the 73 graduates who responded to the survey)

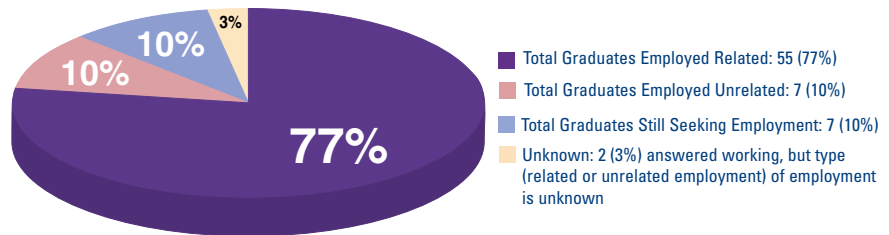
### Employment Status

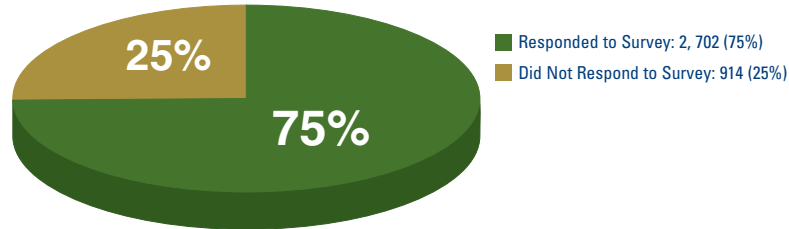

### Algonquin Graduates Response to Survey

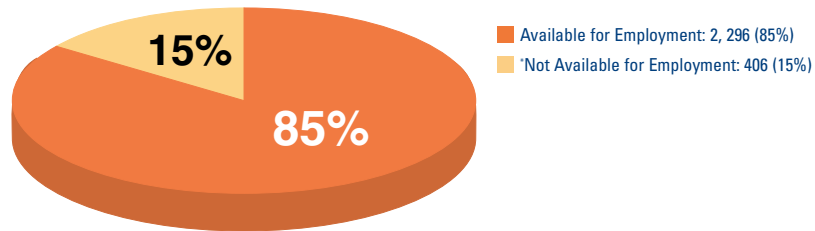

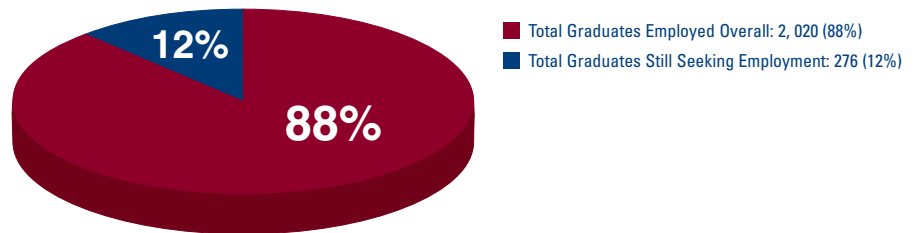

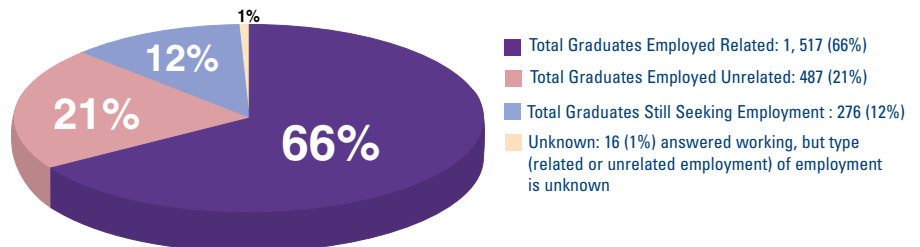
### Employment Status

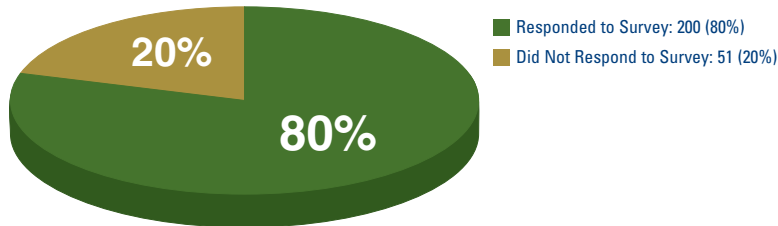

### Algonquin Pembroke Campus Graduates Response to Survey

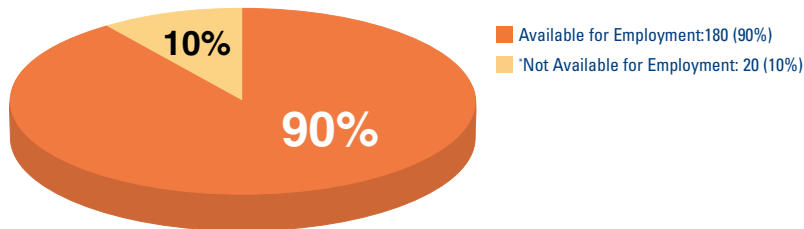

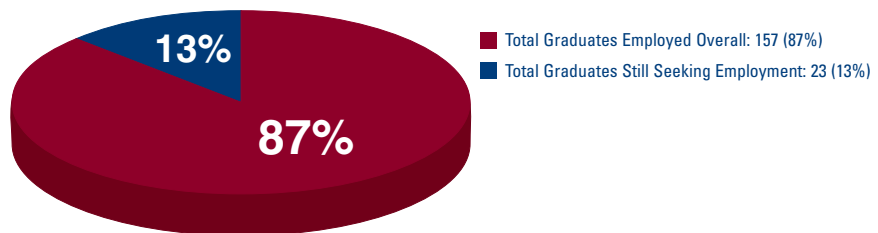

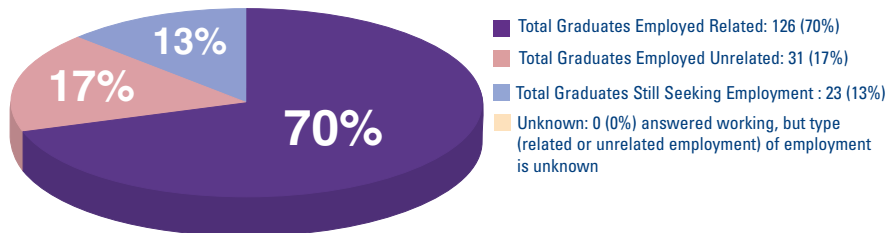
### Employment Status

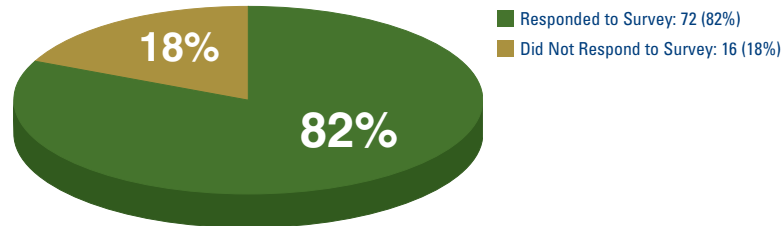

### Algonquin Perth Campus Graduates Response to Survey

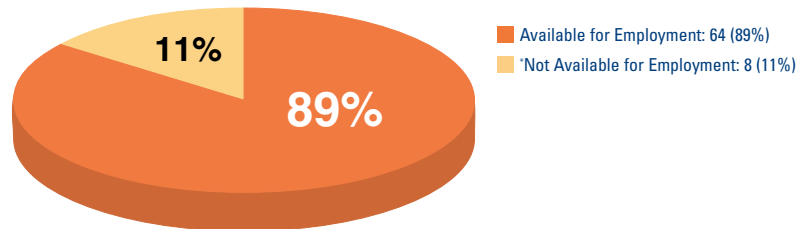

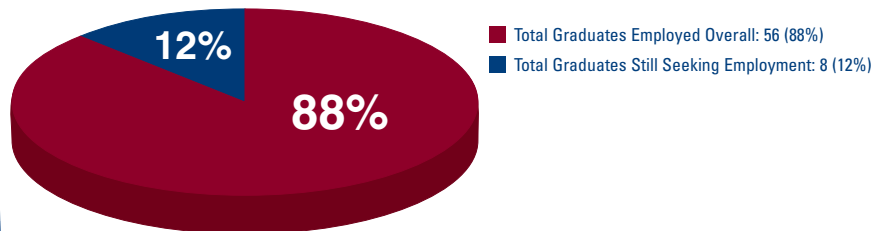

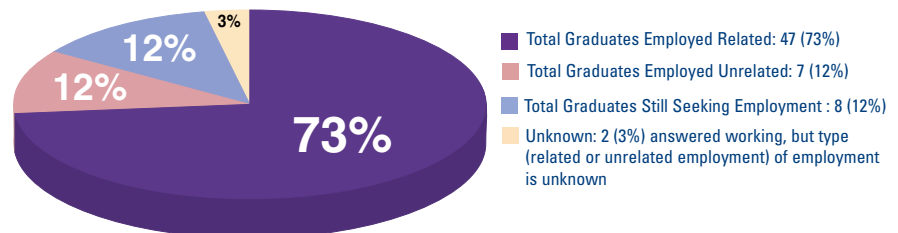
### Employment Status
