
# ACADEMIC UPGRADING COURSES

An initial assessment will determine if you are eligible for Academic Upgrading. Placement tests determine which Communication and/or Mathematics course you start in. The length of time you spend in the program depends on your placement results, which courses you need to reach your academic or employment goals, and your own rate of progress. Durations above indicate the maximum number of weeks to complete each course.



## ACADEMIC UPGRADING

### On average, over 600 former AU students go on to postsecondary programs each year.

Prepare for college programs and/or employment by taking Academic Upgrading courses. Study only the courses you need to meet the admission requirements for your college program of choice, or, earn the Academic and Career Entrance (ACE) certificate. The ACE certificate is recognized across Ontario as a Grade 12 equivalency for admission to college and by many employers as meeting their minimum employment standard.

#### WHEN CAN I START?

**Day:** Intake occurs every second Monday. All students start in a two week Goal Orientation course which includes placement testing in Communication and/or Mathematics.

**Evening:** Intake for Mathematics occurs at the beginning of most months and includes placement testing. Biology and Chemistry start in January and late August. An assessment to determine eligibility must be done *before* these courses start.

AM I ELIGIBLE? Academic Upgrading may be for you if you are:

- 19 years of age or older (students less than 19 years of age must meet with an Academic Access Advisor to determine eligibility)
- ready to set goals for your future
- willing to work and show progress
- prepared to attend regularly
- able to work independently
