THE HISTORY




ALGONQUIN COLLEGE'S PROUD HERITAGE

Algonquin College is situated on unceded, unsurrendered territory of Algonquin people. Traditionally known as "Anishinabe", Algonquin people are the original inhabitants of the wide swath of territory along the Ottawa River on which Algonquin College's campuses in Ottawa, Pembroke, and Perth now sit. To honour and recognize the Algonquin People, the college adopted the name Algonquin when it was founded in 1967.

In Algonquin culture, it is appropriate for guests to acknowledge the hospitality of their hosts when entering their territory. With this tradition in mind, Algonquin College respectfully thanks the Algonquin people for hosting us on their ancestral lands; both today during this ceremony and each day on our campuses in Ottawa, Perth, and Pembroke. Meegwetch (thank you).

Algonquin College is proud of its strong partnership with the First Nation, Métis, or Inuit communities and organizations with whom we share the common goal of supporting Indigenous learners as they strive for academic and career success. This partnership is realized in many ways, one of which is through Algonquin College's Indigenous Education Council (IEC). This council brings members of First Nation communities and organizations together with Algonquin College leaders and students to identify the unique needs of our Indigenous learners and to work together to meet those needs.

As a result of these partnerships, Algonquin College maintains a strong commitment to the over 1,000 learners of First Nation, Métis, and Inuit heritage who attend our institute each year. Algonquin College offers high-quality programs and services reflective of Indigenous culture and values; such as the Mamidosewin Indigenous Student Centre, the Pathways to Indigenous Empowerment Program, the Indigenous Studies Program and the Indigenous Pre-Apprentice Cook Program. Algonquin College is honoured that so many First Nation, Métis, and Inuit learners choose to join the College community.



Honorary Degree Recipient John Stewart

For nearly 40 years, John Stewart has served as a pillar of the Perth community, a close friend of Algonquin College and a widely respected authority on heritage conservation. His commitment to history and the preservation of the past have led to the revitalization of countless historical sites both locally and beyond.

On June 7, Stewart will receive an honorary degree from Algonquin College at the Perth Campus' 2023 Spring Convocation ceremony. He will be one of six to receive the honour, alongside fellow friends of the College Mark Barnes, Wendy Jocko, Deirdre Freiheit, Elizabeth Manley and James Taggart.

Stewart moved to Perth with his family in 1980 as the director of the Main Street program, which sought to revitalize ageing downtown cores. Perth had been chosen as a pilot project for the program and Stewart was responsible for initiating and supervising the plan. It was around this time that the Perth Campus initiated its heritage masonry and carpentry programs, which Stewart saw as an opportunity to both build an important relationship and improve the local community. Stewart served on the board of the campus' trades programs and his business, Commonwealth Historic Resource Management, has hired many alumni. Additionally, his son is a graduate from the Perth Campus' Heritage Carpentry and Joinery program, making the College something of a family affair.

As a business leader and community advocate, Stewart has had to develop a leadership style that lends itself to finding success in a wide variety of situations. When it comes to the leaders of the future, he suggested that good management comes from the ability to recognize and develop the strengths of those of others.

For soon-to-be AC alumni, Stewart advised not looking at graduation as the end of the road, but instead as a stepping stone to bigger things. He referred to degrees and diplomas as passports, tools that allow ambitious graduates a certain understanding of their field without being a be-all-end-all.

GRADUATE FOLLOW-UP SURVEY

As an Algonquin graduate, your success is important to us. Our continued commitment to you in terms of excellence, quality, and accountability includes our participation in the province-wide Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities Key Performance Indicators (KPI) survey.

This survey will be conducted six months following graduation. A consulting firm, Forum Research, will telephone you (they will identify themselves as Algonquin Forum) to administer the graduate version of the KPI survey. The survey collects data related to your college experience, employment status and salary level.

When contacted, Forum Research will ask you what Algonquin College is doing right, and how we can improve, so the Ministry will continue to give your college the support it needs to offer leading-edge education and training.

Forum Research will ask you to provide your current employer's contact information so they, too, can be surveyed about the education and training Algonquin graduates receive. We hope that you will advise your employer that they will be contacted by Forum Research.
