We strongly encourage you to review your immunizations, using the charts below, with your family doctor to ensure your health is protected while you pursue your studies at Algonquin College.

You are also welcome to book an appointment, when you are on campus to receive any outstanding vaccinations at our centre. To book an appointment, please call 613 727-4723 Ex 7222 to speak with reception. You may also book an appointment in person. Remember to bring your Algonquin student card and a valid health insurance card (OHIP, Guard Me etc.) with you to each appointment.

Vaccine	Ontario Schedule Recommendations
Measles, Mumps, Rubella (also known as MMR)	2 doses as a child, or 2 doses 28 days apart as an adult
Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (also known as Tdap)	Received as a child and booster as teen or young adult then every 10 years
Varicella	2 doses as a child, or 2 doses as an adult if not immune
Meningococcal Quadrivalent (for A, C, Y, W-135 strains)	1 dose received in Grade 7
Hepatitis B	2 doses received in Grade 7
Human Papillomavirus (Gardasil [®] or Gardasil 9 [®])	2 doses received in Grade 7
Polio	Immunized as an infant
Pneumococcal	Immunized as an infant
Influenza	Yearly

Vaccine	Additional Recommendations by Algonquin College
Human Papillomavirus (Gardasil [®] 9 - covers 9 strains of HPV)	3 doses for those over 15 years old
Meningococcal Quadrivalent (for A, C, Y, W-135 strains)	Booster dose 16 - 18 years or older
Meningococcal Sero B	2 doses one month apart

Please Note: Not all vaccines are publicly funded. There may be a cost for some vaccines not covered by the Algonquin Student Health Insurance Plan.
