

# Mexican Summer Spanish Immersion Course

The archeological zone of Teotihuacan...

Was designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1987, it is one of the most important and most visited archaeological sites in Mexico.

Teotihuacan's culture and history are still largely mysterious. The civilizations left massive ruins, but no trace has yet been found of a writing system, and very little is known about its inhabitants, who were succeeded first by the Toltecs and latter by the Aztecs.
