



Co-op Abroad

Are you interested in completing your co-op work term in your home country or in another country?

The Co-op and Career Centre and the International Education Centre can support you completing your co-op outside of Canada. Co-op placements are for co-op programs only and must follow the Co-op Office procedures. If you want to complete your mandatory work placement abroad, you should talk to your program coordinator or academic advisor – they can be good sources of information and can confirm which placements qualify for credit (you must confirm with your coordinator that an opportunity abroad is acceptable for your program).

If you are traveling back to your home country for co-op work, you still need to follow the Co-op Office procedures and register your travel with the International Education Centre 60 days before departure/beginning of the work term.

What is My Career Journey? An online tool that provides trusted education and labour market information to help people confidently navigate career pathways in Ontario.

Who is My Career Journey for?

- Current and future post secondary students
- Workers looking to upskill or change careers
- Job seekers, newcomers and people who want to explore pathways to in-demand jobs in Ontario

Where do I start?

- I don't know what career I want to pursue: Visit the 'Plan your career' page and explore 'Career planning tools' to find personalized resources, labour market information, job profiles, career quizzes and planning services.
- I know what career I want and have the right education, but I need help finding a job: Check out the 'Find jobs and employment' page and 'Tools to find jobs' to access job banks and other employment supports. Also learn about job opportunities in specific sectors.
- I know what career I want to pursue but need help finding the right education: Browse the 'Postsecondary education' page and 'Educational tools' to find postsecondary institutions and programs and learn more about admission standards, how to apply and financial assistance.
- I want to pivot to a new career: Go to 'Search in-demand careers' to learn about jobs in high demand careers. Also access career profiles with key insights, including historical number of job postings and required education.


