Algonquin College's Waterfront Campus Sets Enrolment Record

PEMBROKE, ON - In nearly five decades of serving the Upper Ottawa Valley, the enrolment at Algonquin College's Pembroke Campus has never been higher. More than 950 full-time students will be in class this week as the school year begins at the Waterfront Campus in Pembroke.

Campus Dean, Karen Davies, is thrilled with the increased enrolments. "When we opened the Waterfront Campus in fall 2012, we knew it would be a very special place for students to study. The combination of excellent teaching, a good mix of programs, and a state-of-the-art facility has created a campus atmosphere that is very inviting for students and families, and more are choosing to study with us. It's wonderfull," says Davies.

The Pembroke Campus is the largest of Algonquin College's regional campuses and offers 20 full-time programs, ranging from the skilled trades to health sciences. Almost 50 percent of the students who have registered have had to relocate to the Pembroke area to attend their program. The majority of these out-of-town students are enrolled in unique programs like Outdoor Adventure, Outdoor Adventure Naturalist, Forestry Technician, Radiation Safety and Environmental Technician.

Nursing continues to be the program with the largest enrolment with more than 170 students registered in the four-year Bachelor of Science in Nursing Degree, a program that is offered in

collaboration with the University of Ottawa.

Across all programs, there are more than 635 first-year students enrolled, and more than 315 returning students.
