Our Program

This two-level program is intended to prepare beginner-level English second language students to enter the General Arts and Science - English for Academic Purposes (EAP) program. Students build English language skills through reading, writing, grammar, listening and speaking practice.

Class sizes provide an interactive and dynamic classroom experience. Students are part of a rich international and cross-cultural environment created by classmates from a wide-range of language, work and educational backgrounds.

Graduates of the program receive an Algonquin College Certificate and meet the language requirements to enter the EAP program at Algonquin College.

A placement test determines the appropriate level of study.

Additional Information

Curriculum and materials:

The curriculum for each skill prepares the students to progress through the program. Required texts must be purchased.

Teachers and methodology:

Faculty are certified to teach EAP to adult learners. Professors use the latest teaching methods and adapt techniques to meet the needs of diverse groups of students. Students participate in a variety of activities including discussions, presentations and group work. Teachers are available for academic advising.

Placement:

A placement test is used to determine entry level. A reviewof previously obtained sub-scores on standardized tests (IELTS, TOEFL, CELPIP, CAEL) may support a student's placement.

Evaluation:

For progression to the next level, a minimum grade of B- (70%) is required. Upon successful completion of all courses in the program, students receive an Algonquin College Certificate. Students receive regular evaluation through lab assignments, mid-terms and final tests.

Course Descriptions

ESLO100 Pre Writing 1

Students with limited knowledge of English require basic writing skills for day-to-day communication. Students write well organized paragraphs that describe people, places or things, narrate simple events and describe how to do something. Students who excel in this course demonstrate language skills that align with Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) for Languages Level A1.

ESL0101 Pre Reading 1

Students with limited knowledge of English require basic reading skills for day-to-day communication. Students read level-appropriate texts, employ reading strategies and engage in simple reading response tasks to develop reading comprehension and vocabulary skills. Students who excel in this course demonstrate language skills that align with Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) for Languages Level A1.

ESLO105 Pre Grammar 1: Listening and Speaking

Grammatical accuracy is essential for effective oral communication in social, academic and career situations. Through teacher instruction and small group listening and speaking activities, students develop the ability to use basic verb tenses and form simple sentences for a variety of real-world and academic situations. Students who excel in this course demonstrate language skills that align with Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) for Languages Level A1.

ESL0200 Pre Writing 2

Students write coherent and organized narrative and process paragraphs using a combination of simple, compound and complex sentences. Emphasis is placed on paragraph structure: introduction, support and conclusion. Students who excel in this course demonstrate language skills that align with Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) for Languages Level A1+.

ESL0201 Pre Reading 2

Students improve comprehension and develop specific reading strategies and vocabulary. Students read a variety of short texts and participate in text analysis activities. Students who excel in this course demonstrate language skills that align with Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) for Languages Level A1+.

ESL0205 Pre Grammar 2: Listening and Speaking

Clear communication is critical for social, academic and occupational success. Students continue to build their grammar base to produce meaningful, accurate and appropriate oral communication through focused grammar instruction. Students are presented with many opportunities to practise listening and speaking through meaningful and engaging group activities. Students who excel in this course demonstrate language skills that align with Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) for Languages Level A1+.
