- Once you have successfully logged into ACSIS select Network Account Information found on the left of the screen
- The <u>shaded area</u> will have your <u>username</u> and password. This is to be used to access your Brightspace account and Live@AC account. Brightspace is the LMS where you will find the topics/ content and weekly schedules for each of your classes and your email account is your <u>username</u>@algonquinlive.com
- It is a college policy that you check your email and Brightspace accounts at least 3 times a week.

or tank tops)




Comfortable - close toed **black shoes**, max heel of 2inches.
