3.4 Covid - 19/ Students not adhering to Covid-19 protocols The Safety Manager, Occupational Health and Safety stated that waste water levels have decreased, however Covid-19 cases are still high. No major safety concerns for the spring semester. It was also stated that the mandatory mask rules have been extended with no timeline.

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J. Flieler mentioned that faculty members are part of other regulatory bodies and there may be a possibility of the college's mandatory mask timeline not aligning. M. Benkie stated that if that occurs, a review will be conducted.

Members questioned whether the college's vaccine rates are based on the number of people who have been on campus or if they also include the overall number of people working/studying from home as well. Also, since vaccine passports are no longer required, will the campus still be safe.

The Safety Manager, Occupational Health and Safety stated that he is working with 24 other colleges in Ontario and based on our safety measures, we are doing very well.

There are a few cases where people aren't comfortable returning to campus for legitime reasons. If you have members with serious concerns, they may contact HR for accommodation purposes.
