The doctor is in! Health Services provides professional, confidential medical services, geared towards the unique health needs of students and administered by caregivers sensitive to — and experienced with — individual health concerns. Physicians are often available by appointment. Registered Nurses provide assessment and treatment of minor illnesses or injuries. Health Services can provide virtually all the services expected from a family doctor or medical clinic, including:

- · Allergy injections
- Birth control information and prescriptions
- Blood tests (confidential HIV testing available)
- Doctors' appointments
- Emergency treatment (accidents, illnesses)
- Flu shots
- Mental health appointments
- Pap tests
- Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) testing
- Tuberculosis (TB) testing
- Treatment for headaches, colds, etc.
- Vaccinations (including Hepatitis B, tetanus, MMR - mumps/measles/rubella)

In cooperation with Counselling Services and the Centre for Accessible Learning, Health Services offers help with almost any physical or emotional problem a student may encounter.

Students must bring their student card along with proof of health insurance (OHIP or other provincial/international card). For most services, there is no direct cost to students who are covered by health insurance.




