3. Vote on 2025-2026 CAC Chair

At the Chair's invitation, the Council commenced the nomination and election process for the 2025–2026 CAC Chair. C. Chris Melmoth nominated C. Dorè for the Chair position, and after confirming no other nominations, the group agreed to proceed with a vote, resulting in Christopher's unanimous re-election as Chair for the 2025-2026 term.

4. Feedback from President Meeting (2024-2025 CAC Annual Report)

The Chair reported on his May 2025 meeting with President Claude Brulé, during which the Council's annual report was discussed. Key feedback from the President included: appreciation for the Council's contributions and thoughtful recommendations; encouragement to make future reports more specific, including clear action items, timelines, and responsible leads for each identified priority.

President Brulé is scheduled to attend the October meeting to provide an institutional update and engage in discussion with members regarding priorities and alignment with College directions.

5. Soliciting CAC Priorities, 2025-26



The Chair instructed members to gather input from their constituencies on potential priorities for the council, explained the process for submitting these via Priority Listing 2025-26 - College Academic Council.xlsx spreadsheet on the CAC Teams site, and outlined the timeline for reviewing and selecting priorities for working groups. Members are encouraged to consult with their respective constituencies to gather input. A Communication to constituents template is available and will be sent to the CAC members via email.

The Council will review submissions in during next meeting(-s) and establish working groups accordingly. Each working group will research, consult, and prepare recommendations to the Council. Members are encouraged to join at least one working group to share workload and perspectives.
